



Situation Report #61: Occupied Palestine

03 November – 10 November 2025 (until 08:00 AM)

The Government Communication Center at the Prime Minister's Office issues the Situation Report once a week in English, Arabic, Spanish, and French. The next Situation Report will be issued on 17 November 2025.

Key Developments

DAY 31 SINCE THE CEASEFIRE DEAL TOOK EFFECT ON 11 OCTOBER: ISRAEL KILLED [241 PALESTINIANS](#) IN GAZA, WHILE BLOCKING THE ENTRY OF AID

In blatant violation of the ceasefire agreement, the Israeli occupation forces (IOF) have continued their brutal attacks across various areas of the Gaza Strip, killing Palestinian civilians under the false pretext that they crossed the so-called [invisible yellow line](#). According to [Euro-Med](#), Israel has killed one Palestinian every hour since the ceasefire took effect. Adding to the widespread devastation, Israeli occupation forces have continued demolishing residential buildings in Rafah and Khan Younis in southern Gaza, compounding the suffering of forcibly displaced Palestinians—many of whom remain without shelter. At the same time, the Israeli occupation authorities have blocked the entry of [humanitarian aid](#), particularly to northern Gaza, and have denied access to essential shelter materials urgently needed ahead of the winter season. Crossings remain closed, and dozens of aid trucks carrying lifesaving supplies continue to be turned back.

IOF KILLS DEFENSELESS CHILDREN & AN ELDERLY WOMAN IN THE WEST BANK

During the past week, the IOF killed seven Palestinians across the West Bank, including four Palestinian children: [Jamil Hanani](#), [Murad Abu Sfein](#), [Mohammad Taim](#), and [Mohammad Qassem](#), and [73-year-old Haniyya Hanoun](#). According to [UNOCHA](#), one in every five Palestinians martyred by Israel in 2025 was a child. Moreover, the IOF blatantly burned Palestinian olive groves in [Jenin](#), stormed [Al-Mughayyir](#) town, forcibly displaced a Palestinian family, blocked the only entrance to the town, and declared the area a closed military zone. The IOF also [destroyed Palestinian private property and livestock](#) in other parts of the northern West Bank, in addition to using [live fire against peaceful protesters](#) in the northern West Bank. In Beita, south of Nablus, armed [Israeli settler mobs](#) targeted and injured [five Palestinian journalists](#) and one international solidarity activist. According to [UNOCHA](#), "October 2025 recorded the highest monthly number of Israeli settler attacks since OCHA began documenting such incidents in 2006." As confirmed by the [CWRC](#), the Israeli occupation forces and colonial settlers carried out a total of 2350 in October alone. These daily attacks are getting more vicious as armed settlers fire [live ammunition](#) at Palestinian olive harvesters, burn ancient trees, private homes, and property, and attack Palestinians. Furthermore, in occupied Jerusalem, the IOF continued to [forcibly displace families](#) from their homes, demolishing private property and targeting Palestinian civilians.



SETTLER COLONIAL EXPANSION AND LAND THEFT

Additional illegal Israeli settlement expansion plans in the West Bank are underway, with 1,288 housing units to be advanced in two settlements in the northern West Bank. Since the beginning of October 2025, the Israeli occupation has illegally advanced a total of 28,183 housing units across several illegal settlements in the West Bank, including occupied Jerusalem – an "all-time record," according to [Peace Now](#).

ISRAELI PRISONS ARE TORTURE CAMPS FOR PALESTINIANS

In their recent report, Israeli Human Rights Organization [B'Tselem](#) released testimonials from 55 Palestinian men and women held in Israeli prisons and detention centers, most of whom are detained without charges. Their testimonies reveal "deliberate humiliation, severe violence, starvation, sleep deprivation, and denial of medical care and religious practice." Furthermore, in an attempt to seek justice, Palestinian Center for Human Rights - [PCHR](#) submitted a 75-page report to the Committee Against Torture ahead of its review of Israeli crimes in its upcoming 86th session scheduled on 10 November.

OVER 3 MILLION LIFE-YEARS LOST IN GAZA

The [Lancet's](#) latest report exposes Israel's grave human rights violations and the long-term catastrophic humanitarian impact of Israel's genocidal acts against Palestinians in Gaza. The excessive mortality and morbidity rates in Gaza were exacerbated by Israel's incessant attacks against Palestinian civilians and the healthcare infrastructure. These issues were further worsened by severe malnutrition and deliberate starvation caused by Israel's blockade of food, lack of access to clean water, destroyed sanitation infrastructure, and extreme restrictions on medical access. This humanitarian crisis leaves the Palestinian people in Gaza at grave public health risk and results in a short life expectancy, contributing to over 3 million lost life-years in Gaza's population.

EVIDENCE OF ISRAEL'S THEFT OF PALESTINIAN MARTYRS' ORGANS

Citing medical evidence, [Dr. Ghassan Abu Sitta](#) confirmed Israel's systematic organ theft from Palestinian martyrs recently returned from Israeli custody, including the theft of hearts, lungs, kidneys, and corneas. Abu Sitta confirmed "the likelihood that these organs were harvested for the purpose of theft," adding "that these organs were removed in a way that preserves their ability to be transplanted elsewhere."

ISRAEL'S CONTINUED AGGRESSION AGAINST THE NORTHERN WEST BANK

The occupation's aggression has persisted for 294 days against Jenin and its refugee camp, 288 days against Tulkarem and its refugee camp, and 275 days against Nour Shams refugee camp.

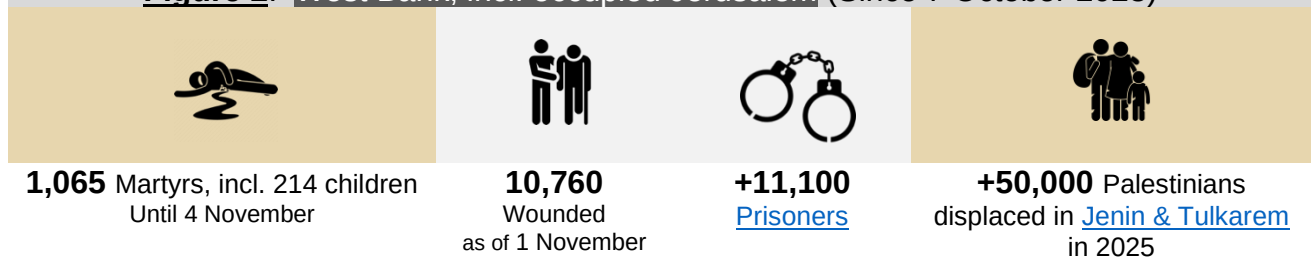


Figure 3: West Bank, incl. occupied Jerusalem |3- 9 November 2025 (until 8 AM)

In Focus

Supported by Netanyahu, a Knesset committee has advanced a bill that would impose the death penalty on Palestinian prisoners, according to [Haaretz](#). A position paper by the Palestinian Centre for Human Rights ([PCHR](#)) explains that the draft legislation stipulates the death penalty for “anyone who intentionally or negligently causes the death of an Israeli citizen out of racist or hateful motives and to harm Israel.” PCHR notes that this bill is not new; it has been repeatedly proposed over the years but has failed to pass. Since 7 October 2023, Israeli occupation authorities have systematically subjected Palestinian prisoners to widespread torture, resulting in the martyrdom of at least 80 detainees. The [Palestinian Cabinet](#) called on the int’l community to fulfill its legal and moral obligations by exerting pressure on Israel to halt the Knesset’s consideration of this bill.

Government Updates

- The Government Operations Room for Emergency Interventions in the Gaza Strip issued an [urgent appeal](#) last Monday, addressed to United Nations, its agencies, and international and humanitarian organizations, to take immediate action to safeguard thousands of displaced families living in coastal and low-lying areas most vulnerable to flooding, rainwater accumulation, and sea surges, particularly given the extensive destruction inflicted on infrastructure by the Israeli occupation genocidal aggression over the past two years.
- At the outset of the [weekly Cabinet session](#) held last Tuesday, Prime Minister Dr. Mohammad Mustafa announced today that the government will circulate its executive program for Gaza’s recovery and reconstruction to all relevant countries and international institutions. The program outlines a strategic vision for recovery and reconstruction priorities and coincides with the publication of the updated Gaza Damage and Needs Assessment, prepared in cooperation with the World Bank and UN agencies. The program reflects the readiness of both the government and international partners to implement the program swiftly, within the constraints posed by the current circumstances.
- As part of its ongoing efforts to develop the healthcare system and strengthen reliance on local capacities in delivering medical services, the Palestinian Government—through the Ministry of Health—continues to improve the quality of services provided to citizens across public hospitals and healthcare facilities. These efforts include expanding specialized medical services, upgrading infrastructure, advancing digital transformation, and [reinforcing health governance](#) in areas such as health insurance and the purchasing of medical services. All initiatives are aligned with national priorities and the National Program for Development and Reform adopted by the Government earlier this year. Within the framework of the Health Sector Reform Plan, the Ministry of Health continues to strengthen the governance of the medical referrals system, standardize prices and contracts with healthcare providers, and enhance efficiency and transparency.
