



Situation Report #64: Occupied Palestine

24 November – 01 December 2025 (until 08:00 AM)

The Government Communication Center at the Prime Minister's Office issues the Situation Report once a week in English, Arabic, Spanish, and French. The next Situation Report will be issued on 8 December 2025.

Key Developments

DAY 52 SINCE THE CEASEFIRE DEAL: ISRAEL HAS KILLED 356 PALESTINIANS IN GAZA, BRINGING THE TOTAL TO 70,103 PALESTINIANS KILLED SINCE THE GENOCIDE BEGAN

As people [across Europe](#) continue to rally against Israel's genocide of the Palestinian people and call for a free Palestine, the occupying Power, Israel, continues to blow up residential buildings and to kill defenseless Palestinians in the Gaza Strip in blatant violation of the ceasefire deal. Last Saturday, an Israeli drone dropped a bomb among civilians, [killing two brothers](#), Juma and Fadi Tamer Abu Assi. The area where this attack occurred is beyond the "Yellow Line." According to [Euro-Med Human Rights Monitor](#), Israel has taken control of 58% of Gaza and continues to shoot at anyone who approaches that line. These harrowing crimes continue to make life for Palestinians in Gaza a living nightmare, along with a cold winter season that is placing people at risk of [floods and hypothermia](#). According to [UNICEF](#), at least 67 children have been killed since the ceasefire took effect on 11 October. Repeatedly [blocking essential humanitarian aid](#) from entering the strip, Israel continues to [fire at fishermen](#) seeking food for their families, while malnutrition persists, and 9,300 children under 5 years of age suffer from [acute malnutrition](#). The [public health crisis](#) in Gaza is especially grave. Some [hospitals were flooded](#) from heavy rainfall, while disease spreads due to the destroyed sanitation infrastructure, and an estimated [10,000 martyr bodies are](#) still trapped under the rubble.

CONTINUED ISRAELI ATTACKS IN THE WEST BANK: MILITARY ASSAULTS, SUMMARY EXECUTIONS, AND SETTLER TERROR ATTACKS

Palestinian's lives in the West Bank are becoming increasingly more endangered, with an average of [47 daily military assaults](#) and Israel's persistent violations and crimes across the occupied State of Palestine. OHCHR has verified that Israeli forces and settlers have killed [1,030 Palestinians](#) in the West Bank, including 233 children, since 7 October 2023. One documented crime involved the cold-blooded [extrajudicial killing of two unarmed Palestinian men](#) in the northern West Bank city of Jenin. [International experts](#) say such crimes against Palestinians represent a state policy, calling for accountability and prosecution from international courts due to Israel's failure to abide by international law. Additionally, the Israeli occupation forces (IOF) launched a major offensive on [Tubas Governorate](#), injuring more than [200 Palestinians](#), detaining at least 200 more, blocking roads, attacking journalists, and even preventing ambulances from reaching the injured. Other Israeli criminal attacks across the occupied West Bank included [firing tear gas at a children's kindergarten](#) near Hebron. Meanwhile, armed Israeli settler mobs continue to enjoy impunity and backing from the Israeli government. According to UNOCHA, over [1,000 Palestinians have been injured in Israeli settler attacks since the beginning of 2025](#).



AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL: ISRAEL'S GENOCIDE CONTINUES UNABATED

Despite the ceasefire and the release of all living Israeli hostages, Israel is still carrying out genocide against Palestinians in the occupied Gaza Strip by "continuing to deliberately inflict conditions of life calculated to bring about their physical destruction." According to [Amnesty](#), there is no sign of change in Israel's intent.

ONGOING: DEMOLISHING PALESTINIAN HOMES AND EXPANDING ISRAELI SETTLEMENTS

Palestinian families forcibly displaced by Israel continue to suffer as Israel blocks their return to their homes and [plans to demolish](#) 23 more Palestinian houses in the Jenin refugee camp. [UNOCHA](#) has documented the demolition of 21 Palestinian-owned structures in just one week. Alongside the demolitions of Palestinian homes, Israel continues to expand its settlements. Just recently, Israel approved a [master plan to establish an industrial zone](#), seizing 790 dunams of land in the northern West Bank. Additionally, [Peace Now](#) reports that a group of settlers recently took over 10 dunams of Palestinian land, constructing a new colonial installation (outpost) in Sur Baher village in occupied Jerusalem.

THE SCALE OF DESTRUCTION IN OCCUPIED PALESTINE HAS REACHED UTTER RUIN

[The UN Conference on Trade and Development](#) reports that the prolonged Israeli occupation has led to a socioeconomic collapse, and the level of destruction has caused multiple crises affecting all aspects of Palestinian life, including economic, humanitarian, environmental, and social areas. The report stated: "Israeli military operations have ravaged vital infrastructure, including hospitals, universities, schools, places of worship, cultural heritage sites, water and sanitation systems, agricultural land, and telecommunications and energy networks."

THE GUARDIAN: CONVINCING EVIDENCE ISRAEL BACKED GAZA AID CONVOY LOOTERS

According to an eyewitness testimony presented by [historian Jean-Pierre Filiu](#), Israel attacked security personnel protecting aid convoys, permitting looters to seize large quantities of food and other supplies. Filiu also accused the IOF of "attacking a new route recently opened by international aid organisations to allow them to avoid looting blackspots."

THE PALESTINIAN MINISTRY OF WOMEN'S AFFAIRS: REPORT ON THE OCCUPATION'S VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND GIRLS DURING ISRAELI GENOCIDE IN GAZA

The [report](#) exposes Israel's systematic genocidal policy against Palestinian women across the State of Palestine, targeting the Palestinian social fabric and exposing women to high levels of compounded violence. It particularly highlights the cruel treatment of Palestinian women held in Israeli prisons, who are subjected to the harshest forms of violence, including torture, sexual violence, medical neglect, isolation, and threats. While in Geneva, the [Head of UN Women](#) stated, "No woman or girl should have to fight this hard just to survive. We need the killings to stop."

ISRAEL'S CONTINUED AGGRESSION AGAINST THE NORTHERN WEST BANK

The occupation's aggression has persisted for 315 days against Jenin and its refugee camp, 309 days against Tulkarem and its refugee camp, and 289 days against Nour Shams refugee camp.

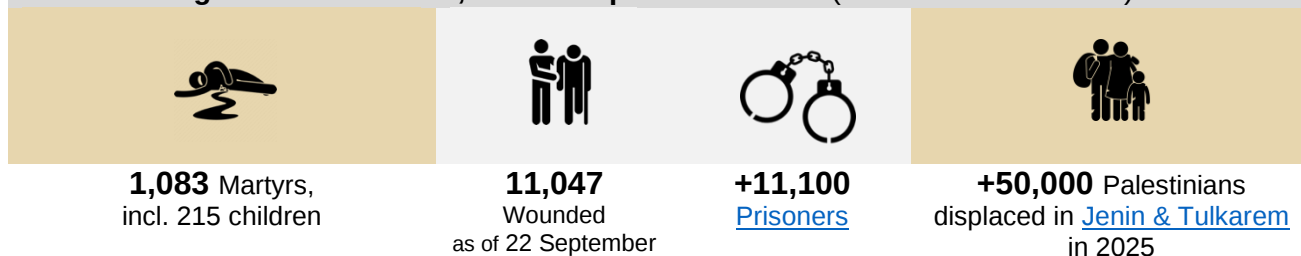


Figure 3: West Bank, incl. occupied Jerusalem | 23– 30 November 2025 (until 8 AM)

In Focus

The occupying Power, Israel, has significantly increased its use of torture and severe abuses against Palestinian detainees since the Gaza genocide began in October 2023. Shocking testimonies collected from Palestinian prisoners reveal an unprecedented deterioration and expansion of systematic punitive and deprivation policies in Israeli prisons. Prisoners confirmed that recent days have seen a notable tightening of punishments, including food reductions, prohibitions on clothing entry, deprivation of medical treatment, and the deliberate failure to provide medical intervention. The testimonies expose the gruesome and inhumane Israeli torture practices used against Palestinian prisoners, including rape, sexual abuse, and other sadistic methods. Legal teams from the [Commission of Detainees and Ex-Detainees Affairs](#), who conducted multiple visits to various prisons, indicated that the situation in Israeli "Ramla Prison" in particular signals a potential humanitarian disaster, as prisoners there face deliberate medical neglect alongside harsh detention conditions. In "Negev Prison," lawyers documented suffocating overcrowding and a rise in skin infections due to a lack of basic sanitation. Malnutrition, declining water quality, and family communication restrictions are prevalent across all Israeli prisons. According to [Haaretz](#), a report submitted by Israeli organizations to the [UN Committee Against Torture](#), states that Israel has escalated its violations of the Convention since 7 October 2023. Israel has dismantled protection mechanisms that previously existed for detainees, and [torture and ill-treatment](#) are being practiced at all stages of detention and by all security forces involved in the process. The [report](#) further highlights that the body of evidence shows severe violations throughout detention, including beatings with batons, scalding with boiling water causing serious burns, dog attacks, the use of a "disco room" with painfully loud music, and rape using objects.

Government Updates

- The Palestinian Government continues to implement wide-ranging reforms aimed at entrenching good governance and strengthening the rule of law, grounded in its conviction that judicial independence and the protection of rights and freedoms are essential to state-building and strengthening public trust in state institutions. A recent [report](#) by the Government Communication Center highlights progress across three priority tracks: Legal and Institutional Framework, Access to Justice, Democratic Practices and Freedom of Expression. Through the [National Program for Development and Reform](#), the Government is also working on reform processes aimed at developing the [national economy and business environment](#).
- During its weekly session on November 25, the Palestinian Cabinet affirmed ongoing preparations and consultations with the Central Elections Commission to hold local elections. Prime Minister Dr. Mohammad Mustafa noted that the Government will soon announce the arrangements for preparing and conducting [local council elections](#), as part of its firm commitment to the reform agenda adopted from day one and in line with the State of Palestine's vision to [strengthen political life](#), uphold [democratic practices](#), and reinforce public trust in national institutions. In light of Israel's continued violations—including the withholding of clearance revenues and market dumping—the Cabinet also discussed gradual, escalating measures to protect the national economy. Additionally, it reviewed proposed amendments to the draft decree-law on e-government services aimed at enhancing governance, advancing digital transformation, and improving service delivery.
