



Situation Report #92: Occupied Palestine

22 Jun – 29 Jun 2026 (until 08:00 AM)

The Government Communication Center at the Prime Minister's Office issues the Situation Report once a week in English, Arabic, Spanish, French, Russian, Chinese, Greek, and Malay. The next Situation Report will be issued on 6 July 2026.

Key Developments

DAY 262 SINCE THE "CEASEFIRE" DEAL: ISRAEL KILLED 1,041 PALESTINIANS IN GAZA, BRINGING THE TOTAL TO 73,054 PALESTINIANS KILLED SINCE THE GENOCIDE BEGAN

Israeli occupation forces (IOF) continue to commit genocide and other atrocity crimes by [deliberately targeting Palestinian children in the Gaza Strip](#), according to the recent [report](#) of the UN Independent International Commission of Inquiry on the Occupied Palestinian Territory, including East Jerusalem, and Israel. The Commission found that since 7 October 2023, the Israeli occupation has killed at least 20,179 children and injured 44,143 others, with children continuing to face starvation, displacement, and the systematic destruction of Gaza's health and education systems. Meanwhile, the Israeli occupation continues to deepen the humanitarian catastrophe in Gaza by further deteriorating living conditions for displaced Palestinians and restricting the delivery of essential humanitarian assistance. According to [UNRWA](#), disease-prevention efforts persist despite severe shortages of critical supplies that have drastically reduced water production and heightened public health risks. The IOF also continues to forcibly displace and target the Palestinian people, causing additional civilian casualties while imposing restrictions that obstruct humanitarian access and the delivery of life-saving aid throughout the Gaza Strip. Local medical sources reported that an Israeli drone strike on al-Taybeh camp in the al-Mawasi area, west of Khan Younis, [killed a Palestinian child](#) and injured several other Palestinians. A [Palestinian man later succumbed to wounds](#) sustained in an earlier Israeli strike on Gaza City, while Israeli gunfire west of Khan Younis wounded another Palestinian. In northern Gaza, an Israeli drone strike targeting a group of Palestinians in the Beit Lahia Housing Project [killed one Palestinian and injured several others](#). Near the entrance to al-Maghazi refugee camp in central Gaza, another Israeli drone strike [killed three Palestinians](#) and wounded several more.

ISRAEL'S SYSTEMATIC, ESCALATING MEASURES TO DISMANTLE THE OSLO ACCORDS

Further to repeated statements by Israeli officials and a series of legislative, administrative, and political measures aimed at [undermining and dismantling the Oslo framework](#), the Israeli Knesset's Foreign Affairs and Defense Committee will, for the first time in decades, convene a special session to review what Israel alleges are Palestinian Authority violations of the Oslo Accords, alongside Israel's response to these claims. The planned review follows a series of measures that increasingly challenge the legal and institutional foundations governing Israeli-Palestinian relations established under the Oslo Accords since the 1990s. The discussion is expected to examine a broad range of issues, including security, economic affairs, border control, environmental matters, holy sites, and archaeological heritage.



SYSTEMATIC ICONFISCATION OF PALESTINIAN LAND FOR SETTLEMENT EXPANSION

According to the Israeli organization [Peace Now](#), Israeli occupation authorities declared approximately 465 dunams of Palestinian land belonging to the villages of Sinjil and al-Luban ash-Sharqiya as "state land" on 24 June 2026 to facilitate the "retroactive legalization" and future expansion of the "Haroeh" colonial installation (outpost), also known as "Karmi Oz." The declared area significantly exceeds the current built-up footprint of this colonial installation, enabling further settlement expansion and strengthening territorial contiguity between surrounding Israeli settlements at the expense of Palestinian territorial contiguity. Peace Now noted that the declaration forms part of an accelerated Israeli policy of land appropriation and the retroactive 'legalization' of colonial installations across the occupied West Bank. According to the organization, these measures further fragment occupied Palestine, restrict Palestinian access to their land and natural resources, and undermine prospects for sustainable Palestinian development. According to the Palestinian [Colonization and Wall Resistance Commission](#) (CWRC), Israeli occupation authorities have declared more than 28,000 dunams of land in the occupied West Bank as "state land" since October 2023, as part of an ongoing policy facilitating settlement expansion and de-facto annexation.

ESCALATING ISRAELI COLONIAL SETTLER TERROR FUELED BY PERSISTENT IMPUNITY

According to [data](#) from the Israeli occupation military and the Israeli internal security and counterintelligence service (Shabak/Shin Bet), [settler terrorism against Palestinians](#) in the occupied West Bank continued to escalate throughout 2025, amid a marked decline in Israeli 'law enforcement' efforts. Reported ideologically motivated attacks by Israeli settlers increased by 27% compared with 2024, while serious attacks—including shootings, arson, and violent assaults—rose by more than 50%. Since October 2023, more than 1,700 settler terror attacks have been documented, resulting in the killing or injury of over 845 Palestinians. In 2025 alone, these attacks have resulted in the martyrdom of four Palestinians and injuries to more than 200 others. The olive harvest season witnessed a significant surge in terror attacks, with 126 assaults recorded across 70 Palestinian towns and villages. These attacks included assaults on farmers, the destruction of property, and the uprooting or vandalism of more than 4,000 olive trees and saplings, causing extensive damage to agricultural land and livelihoods. Meanwhile, investigations by the Israeli occupation authorities into settler attacks declined by 73%. According to longstanding monitoring by the Israeli [Yesh Din](#), only approximately 3% of investigations into ideologically motivated crimes committed by Israelis against Palestinians since 2005 have resulted in convictions, reinforcing a persistent climate of impunity.

ISRAEL'S CONTINUED AGGRESSION AGAINST THE NORTHERN WEST BANK

The occupation's aggression has persisted for 525 days against Jenin and its refugee camp, 519 days against Tulkarem and its refugee camp, and 499 days against Nour Shams refugee camp, displacing more than [33,000 Palestinian refugees](#) since January 2025.

In Focus

Israeli occupation authorities continue to subject Palestinian detainees to widespread and systematic human rights violations, including torture and other cruel, inhuman, and degrading treatment. [Palestinian prisoners' institutions](#) have documented abuses such as severe beatings, prolonged stress positions, electric shocks, sleep deprivation, starvation, denial of medical care, enforced disappearance, sexual violence, and other forms of physical and psychological torture from arrest through detention. Prison conditions are inhumane, with reports of deliberate disease spread, inadequate food and water, and denial of essential healthcare, creating environments of continuous abuse and "slow killing." The case of [former administrative detainee and journalist Mujahid Bani Mufleh](#) highlights the long-term impact of these practices. After his release in January 2026, he suffered a severe brain hemorrhage and continues to require extensive medical treatment. His testimony details extreme hunger, humiliation, physical suffering, and deprivation of basic human dignity. [Pregnant Palestinian women in Israeli detention](#) face starvation, humiliation, harsh interrogations, strip searches, and denial of adequate prenatal healthcare, endangering their lives and those of their unborn children. Currently, three pregnant Palestinian women are held under these conditions. Advocacy organizations report that hundreds of released detainees suffer severe physical and psychological trauma, with some dying shortly after release due to the abuse endured. Israeli occupation prisons currently hold more than [3,376 Palestinian administrative detainees](#) without charge or trial, and over 360 Palestinian children, raising serious concerns about arbitrary detention and the protection of minors under international law. Multiple UN mechanisms have echoed these concerns, citing systematic torture, sexual abuse, arbitrary detention, and denial of fundamental rights, and have called for independent investigations and accountability.

Government Updates

During its weekly session last Tuesday, the [Palestinian Cabinet](#) reaffirmed its commitment to advancing the Government's reform agenda, with a particular focus on governance and public financial management to strengthen institutional performance, transparency, accountability, and fiscal sustainability amid ongoing economic challenges. The Cabinet highlighted President Mahmoud Abbas's approval of amendments to the Value Added Tax (VAT) Law, enabling the launch of a comprehensive institutional development program within the Ministry of Finance, the establishment of a Higher Council for Public Revenues, and the modernization of financial administration across directorates, align with international standards, combat tax evasion and smuggling, and safeguard the delivery of essential public services. Building on broader fiscal reforms under the 2026 Emergency Budget, the Cabinet also approved the General Policy for the Telecommunications and Information Technology Sector (2026–2028) to accelerate digital transformation, strengthen the telecommunications sector, enhance government digital services, and improve digital governance. In addition, it endorsed the replacement of paper health insurance cards with smart cards as part of healthcare modernization efforts, aimed at improving service efficiency, data security, and the future expansion of digital health services.
