



Situation Report #94: Occupied Palestine

06 Jul – 13 Jul 2026 (until 08:00 AM)

The Government Communication Center at the Prime Minister's Office issues the Situation Report once a week in English, Arabic, Spanish, French, Russian, Chinese, Greek, and Malay. The next Situation Report will be issued on 20 July 2026.

Key Developments

DAY 276 SINCE THE "CEASEFIRE" DEAL: ISRAEL KILLED 1,100 PALESTINIANS IN GAZA, BRINGING THE TOTAL TO 73,223 PALESTINIANS KILLED SINCE THE GENOCIDE BEGAN

Israeli occupation forces (IOF) continue to deepen the humanitarian catastrophe in the Gaza Strip through sustained military attacks, restrictions on humanitarian access, and the continued degradation and destruction of civilian infrastructure. The [humanitarian conditions continue to deteriorate](#) as severe shortages of clean water, inadequate sanitation services, and growing public health risks affect the vast majority of the Palestinian people, while thousands of displaced Palestinians remain in overcrowded shelters. Against this backdrop, IOF attacks across the Gaza Strip continue to inflict more civilian casualties and further disregarding Palestinian lives. On Tuesday, an Israeli airstrike on the Tel al-Hawa neighborhood south of Gaza City [killed two Palestinians, including a child](#), and injured four others. On the same day, [IOF detained seven Palestinian fishermen](#) while they were working off the coast of al-Zawayda in central Gaza, taking them to an undisclosed location. On Wednesday, Israeli attacks in Khan Younis and Gaza City [killed six more Palestinians, including two children](#). The following day, an Israeli drone strike targeting a civilian vehicle west of Gaza City [killed one Palestinian and injured several others](#). On Friday, IOF continued to carry out military attacks across the Gaza Strip using drones, artillery, naval vessels, and armored vehicles, [injuring at least 15 Palestinians in continued violations of the "ceasefire"](#). The same day, an Israeli quadcopter drone [targeted Kamal Adwan Hospital](#) in northern Gaza, [injuring at least three medical workers](#), further crippling a devastated healthcare system already operating on the brink of collapse.

ISRAEL'S SYSTEMATIC ARBITRARY DETENTION AND TORTURE OF PALESTINIAN PRISONERS CONTINUES

[UN experts](#) called for the immediate release of Dr. Hussam Abu Safiya and all arbitrarily detained Palestinian health workers, stating that his detention without charges or trial reflects Israel's systematic targeting of Palestinian health workers and "the continuing decimation of the health care system in Gaza in order to inflict conditions to bring about the mental and physical destruction of Palestinians". [Human rights groups](#) also condemned an authenticated image showing a blindfolded, bound, and stripped Palestinian detainee in Israeli custody. Physicians for Human Rights Israel stated that the image "confirms what thousands of testimonies from Palestinian detainees have exposed" and concluded that "Israeli detention facilities are torture camps for Palestinians," highlighting ongoing torture and degrading treatment in Israeli occupation military detention facilities.

ISRAEL ACCELERATES DE FACTO ANNEXATION OF THE OCCUPIED WEST BANK

A joint [report published by Israeli organizations Peace Now and Kerem Navot](#) concludes that, during its first three years in office, the current Israeli government has significantly accelerated the de facto annexation of the occupied West Bank through a coordinated set of measures, including structural



governance changes, transfer of powers, settlement expansion, establishment of new settlement installations (outposts), forced displacement of Palestinians, land appropriation, extensive infrastructure investment, and changes to the land regime. The report documents the measures advanced by the Israeli government during this period and demonstrates how they form a single, systematic government policy aiming to deepen Israeli control over the West Bank and advance de facto annexation. The report documents the establishment of 185 new colonial outposts, the advancement of plans for 40,064 settlement units, the creation of 102 new settlements through legalization and expansion, the forcible displacement of 118 Palestinian shepherding communities, the declaration of nearly 26,000 dunams of Palestinian land as "state land," and the expansion of colonial settler control over more than 1.1 million dunams across the occupied West Bank.

ESCALATING ISRAELI VIOLATIONS AND ATTACKS AGAINST PALESTINIAN JOURNALISTS

The [Palestinian Journalists Syndicate](#) (PJS) reported a sharp escalation in Israeli occupation forces' (IOF) attacks on Palestinian journalists throughout June 2026, documenting 89 crimes against journalists, media workers, and journalism students. According to PJS, these crimes included killings, arrests, injuries, arbitrary detention, physical assaults, threats, the obstruction of media coverage, property destruction, and theft. The report states that IOF repeatedly prevented journalists from carrying out their duties by firing tear gas and stun grenades, intimidating reporters, forcibly removing them from reporting locations, and restricting access to areas of public interest. The IOF also arrested journalists while covering events in the field or during Israeli military raids, while Israeli colonial settlers assaulted and robbed media workers in the occupied West Bank. The killing of Al Jazeera cameraman [Ahmed Wishah](#), who was killed IOF targeted his family home in Al-Bureij refugee camp, further underscores Israel's systematic targeting of press freedom and its deliberate efforts to obstruct reporting and silence the truth on Israeli crimes committed against Palestinians.

CATASTROPHIC HUMANITARIAN CONDITIONS AND FORCED DISPLACEMENT IN THE GAZA STRIP

[Israel's ongoing military attacks](#), siege, and repeated displacement orders continue to create catastrophic living conditions for the Palestinian people in Gaza. More than 1.9 million people remain displaced, many multiple times, while overcrowded displacement sites face widespread sewage, waste accumulation, rodent infestations, contaminated water, and the collapse of essential services. The UN reported that skin and parasitic infections affect more than 80% of displacement sites, while thousands of bodies remain trapped beneath the rubble. Meanwhile, [Euro-Med Human Rights Monitor](#) warned that Israel has confined around 2.1 million Palestinians to an increasingly restricted area under conditions it described as more densely overcrowded than the Srebrenica enclave before the 1995 genocide, arguing that the combination of siege, forced displacement, destruction of civilian infrastructure, and denial of the conditions necessary for survival constitutes a coercive environment that facilitates the forcible displacement of the Palestinian people.

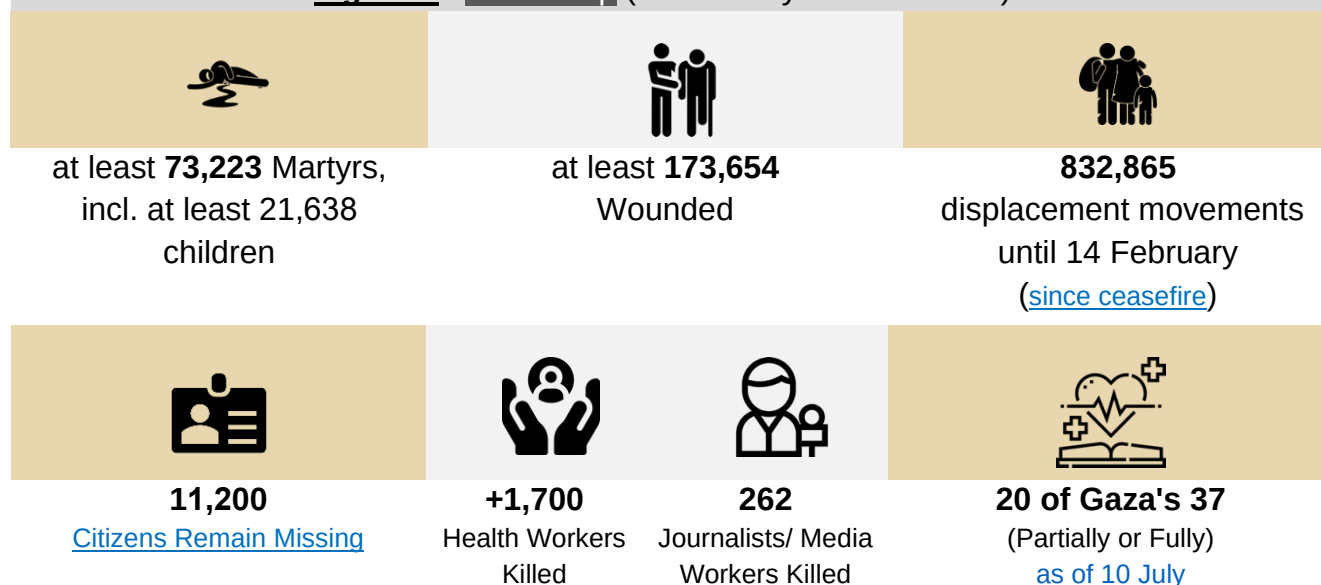
ISRAEL'S CONTINUED AGGRESSION AGAINST THE NORTHERN WEST BANK

The occupation's aggression has persisted for 539 days against Jenin and its refugee camp, 533 days against Tulkarem and its refugee camp, and 513 days against Nour Shams refugee camp, displacing more than [33,000 Palestinian refugees](#) since January 2025.

Figure 2: West Bank, incl. occupied Jerusalem (Since Early October 2023)

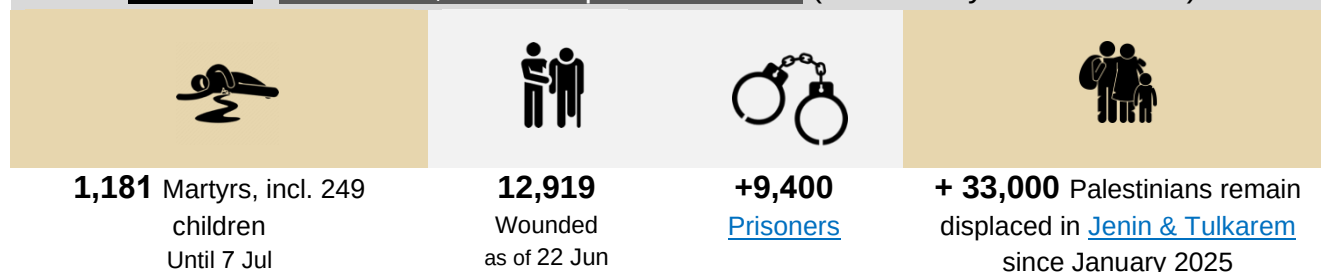
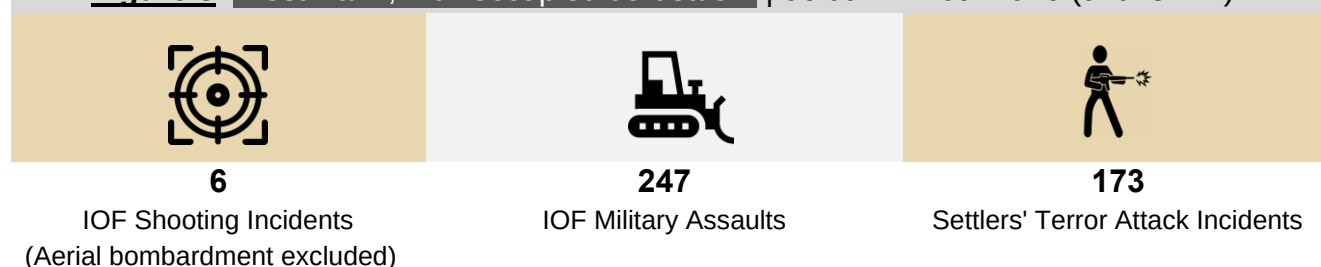


Figure 3: West Bank, incl. occupied Jerusalem | 06 Jul - 12 Jul 2026 (until 8 AM)

In Focus

Israeli occupation authorities and colonial settler militias significantly intensified their attacks against Palestinians across the occupied West Bank during the first half of 2026, resulting in widespread displacement, destruction of property, and severe restrictions on daily life. According to the [Colonization and Wall Resistance Commission](#), IOF and settlers carried out 11,074 documented attacks during the first six months of 2026, including forced displacement, demolitions, land confiscation, destruction of agricultural land, movement restrictions, and the use of lethal force. Settlers alone carried out 3,488 attacks, resulting in the killing of 17 Palestinians, the displacement of 26 Bedouin communities—including the complete forced transfer of 18 them—and the uprooting or destruction of 45,195 trees, including 26,395 olive ones. During the same period, Israeli occupation authorities demolished 740 Palestinian structures, affecting 923 Palestinians, including 546 children, while issuing 254 additional demolition notices targeting Palestinian properties. [Médecins Sans Frontières](#) (MSF) reported that Israeli military checkpoints, movement restrictions, military incursions, and settler attacks continue to obstruct Palestinians' access to healthcare and humanitarian assistance, exposing civilians and medical teams to persistent risks. The [UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs](#) (UNOCHA) further reported that more than 3,200 Palestinians have been displaced in 2026 due to demolitions and settler attacks—an average of 17 people per day, twice the daily rate recorded over the previous three years. Continued demolitions, movement restrictions, and settler attacks are further undermining Palestinians' access to housing, livelihoods, and other essential services.

Government Updates

Prime Minister Dr. Mohammad Mustafa directed, at the last week's Cabinet session, all government institutions to [intensify field visits and interventions across Palestinian towns and villages](#), particularly those targeted by Israeli occupation and settler attacks, while mobilizing every possible resource to strengthen citizens' steadfastness, expand government support, and help alleviate their hardships. The Cabinet also commended the efforts of the Ministry of Education in ensuring the continuity of education in the Gaza Strip. Despite more than 1,000 days of war, the Ministry has successfully administered the General Secondary Education Examination (Tawjihi) to more than 100,000 students over the past three years in Gaza, supported by virtual schools and educational learning points serving hundreds of thousands of students. The successful implementation of electronic Tawjihi examinations also marked an important step in advancing digital assessment and the digital transformation of the education sector. The Cabinet reviewed the updated 2026 Development Projects Priorities Document, which provides a national framework for guiding development efforts in the West Bank. It identifies dozens of strategic projects, many of which have been prepared in anticipation of securing financing for implementation. Additionally, The Cabinet approved, in its final reading, the Draft Decree-Law on Quotas and Commodity Lists and referred it to the President for issuance in accordance with the applicable legal procedures. The legislation aims to enhance transparency, equal opportunity, and anti-monopoly safeguards in quota allocation through clear criteria and the establishment of a dedicated allocation committee. Moreover, the Cabinet discussed, in its first reading, the Draft Regulation on the Governance of Health Services Professions, which seeks to regulate professional practices, protect service beneficiaries—including children, women, and older persons—ensure access to services based on human dignity, and establish complaint and grievance mechanisms for recipients.
